



- We will create environments where network members feel a sense of belonging to thrive personally, professionally, and in collaboration with others













Why Do We Need a City-Wide OST Data Collection?

We want an accurate count of the total number of summer OST programs and youth served to help us (Akron's 150+ youth organizations) determine which youth are NOT being served and which neighborhoods do NOT have equal opportunities...



Five Important Factors to Follow

- 1. Register your organization in the portal
 - If you are already registered, you can update your details
 - This only needs to be done once
- 2. Define Programs for your organization (using the Edit Programs button)
 - This program information will be used for the Program Finder
 - This will only need to be done once for every different program an organization runs
- 3. Define any Sites (using the Edit Sites button)
 - This will be used for your programs locations.
 - This may be the same as the organization headquarters, but might not be
 - This will only need to be done once, unless you change sites/addresses
- 4. Add program sessions for the programs defined above
 - Program sessions are defined for each session of the program
- 5. Add Student Rosters to Program Sessions
 - A new roster will be needed for every program session.





- Importance of youth participation in OST opportunities




New Process to Submit OST Programs to 211

OST Benefits of using ACE Ohio



Your organization may be eligible to receive a portion of these funds as additional revenue while helping families and children in your community by becoming a **Q**ualified **E**ducation **S**ervice **P**rovider.

Who Qualifies to be a QESP? (Qualified Education Service Provider)

Before and After-school programs

Day Camps (academic, music, and arts)

Learning Pods (Tuition Learning Extension Centers)

Student excused due to "compulsory attendance law"

Educational Learning or Study Skills Services



*Physical Education Activities (Physical Education | Ohio Department of Education)

How ACE OHIO Dollars can be used



- Before or after-school educational materials
- Camps
- Learning extension centers
- Learning pods
- Curriculum, manipulatives and consumable materials

(*homeschool only)

- Study skills services
- Field trips
- Language classes
- Instrument lessons
- Tutoring



How ACE OHIO Dollars cannot be used

- 1) Daycare/ Childcare, or Nanny Services
- 2) If organization uses federal funds / grants in whole or part for the services being provided
- 3) Life skills, health, holistic development, and social -emotional programs are not allowable education activities
- 4) Therapy services, consulting, or counseling services are not allowable
- 5) Physical activities cannot be apart of organized team, league, or competition.
- 6) Computers or equipment of any kind are not reimbursed for.


